For example, hearing the description of a scent will engage the brain's sensory cortex. Touching elements of a tale can prompt the brain to release the hormone oxytocin, which can boost feelings of empathy, and a happy ending triggers dopamine, which can result in optimism.

This sensory experience

creates a bond between the

storyteller and the listener, linking their experiences together and building trust. Hearing someone's life story helps the listener understand the narrator on a personal level, strengthening their relationship. In health care, patients with a new diagnosis may find that stories from others who have gone through the same experience are more helpful than reading data and statistics about their condition. Caregivers for people with dementia can cultivate stronger bonds with their patients by knowing details from their life stories, which can also serve as comforting tools.


A Legend of Luxury
