

The Path to Liberty

The 13 Colonies' fight for independence began in Boston over two centuries ago. Today, visitors can step into history by walking the Freedom Trail through the city.

The 2.5-mile red brick path links 16 historic sites, famous for their role in the American Revolution and the nation's early days. Here are some notable stops:

Boston Common. The south end of the trail starts here, at America's oldest public park, founded in 1634. Hundreds of Redcoats camped on its 45 acres during the British occupation of Boston.

Faneuil Hall. Called the Cradle of Liberty, this building was the site for town meetings and public protests of royal decrees. The structure was named for Peter Faneuil, a merchant who built it as the city marketplace.

Old South Meeting House. Over 5,000 Colonists packed Boston's largest public building at the time to rally against the tea tax, a protest that led to the Boston Tea Party. Bunker Hill Monument. A 221-foot-tall granite pillar commemorates the 1775 Battle of Bunker Hill, which was the Revolution's first major clash.

The USS Constitution warship, Massachusetts State House, Paul Revere House, the Old North Church and other churches and cemeteries are included on the trail. For a virtual tour, go to *TheFreedomTrail.org*.

When he's later found dead, Kya is the prime suspect. Following two timelines, the mystery of this novel slowly unravels in a thought-provoking story that weaves nature and human behavior in a fascinating way. A film adaptation was released in July of 2022.



Memorable Melody: 'Don't Be Cruel'

Elvis Presley released this bouncy, rockabilly song in July 1956. Legendary songwriter Otis Blackwell penned the lovelorn lyrics that include the catchy plea, "Don't be cruel to a heart that's true." This single was the B-side to another tune you might recognize, "Hound Dog," making the double-sided hit record one of the most famous in music history. "Don't Be Cruel" took the No. 1 spot on the pop, country and rhythm and blues charts, and later that fall, the future King of Rock 'n' Roll performed it for fans on "The Ed Sullivan Show."
